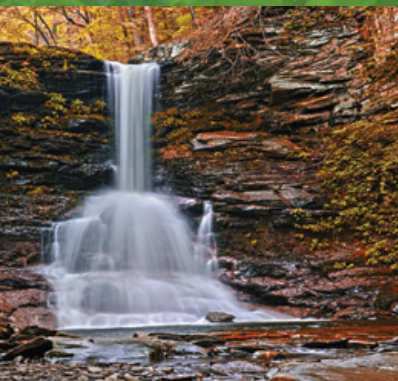

Welcome to the Endless Mountains of Northeastern Pennsylvania

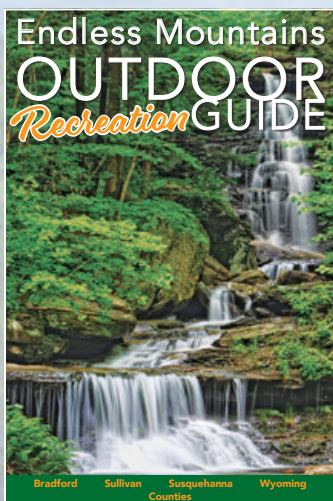

"A lot of people have commented that they couldn't believe how quiet it was. It's just completely silent—no noise from the street," he explained. "And we have the dark nights. When you don't have the intrusion of artificial light, you see the black sky filled with stars. It's great."

Strausser recalled hosting a family that included three generations. The grandparents, their adult children, their grandchildren, and the family dogs all came to **Thorne Haven at Laporte** for a summer getaway.

"The grandparents were rocking on the swing, and they watched their grown kids that were out in the pond. One was throwing a baseball to the grandson. A couple of the kids were swimming," remembered Strausser. "They were just reconnecting and having fun together. That, I think, is what it's all about. That's what our region in the Endless Mountains will do for people."

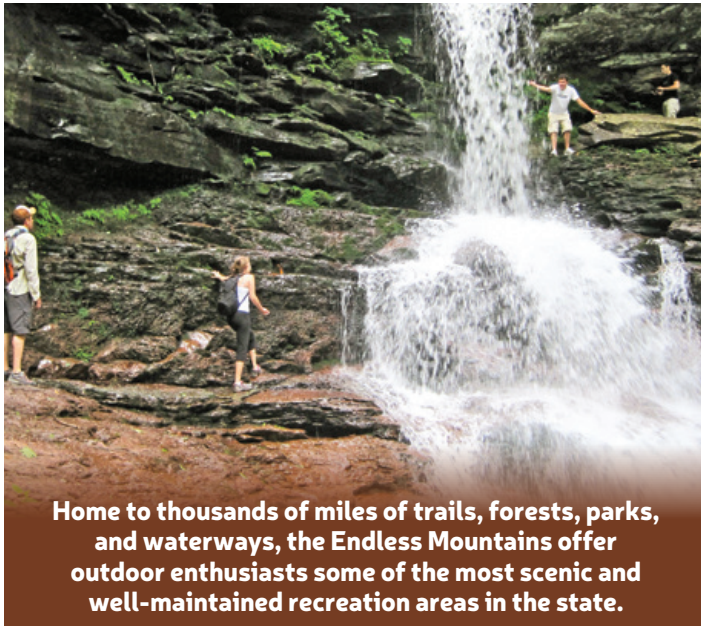

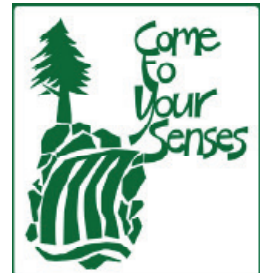

Adventures



NEW GRAVEL LOOP OFFERS 400+ MILES TO Explore

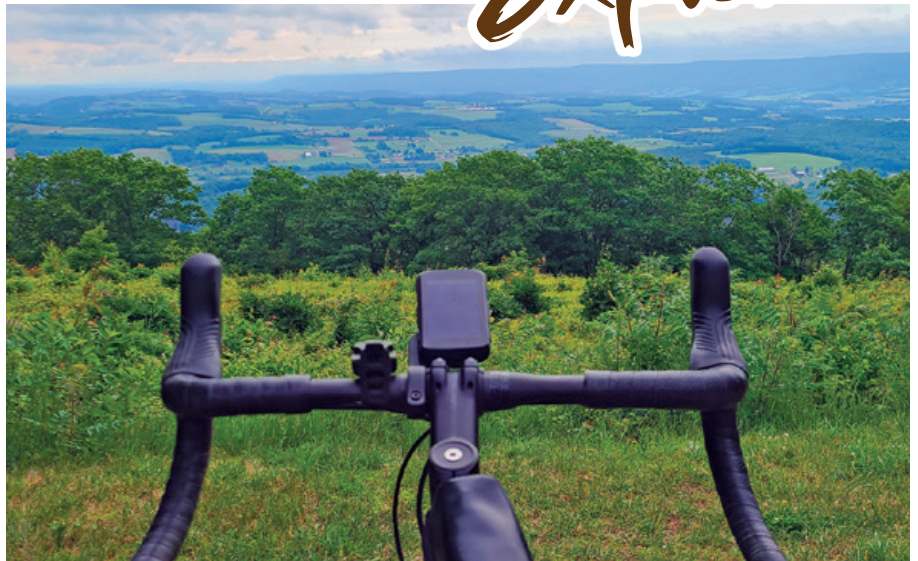
With our quiet backroads and pristine trails, the Endless Mountains have long been gravel riding's best-kept secret. Now, a new route is putting the region on the map for adventure cyclists.

The Endless Mountains Gravel Bikepacking Loop (EMGBL) encompasses over 400 miles of existing dirt roads and trails to create one epic ride. The route travels through Bradford, Sullivan, Susquehanna, and Wyoming counties and boasts about 32,000 feet of elevation change. After all, with a name like the Endless Mountains, you know you're in for some challenging climbs and stunning scenery.

Bikepacking is similar to long-distance backpacking, where cyclists load up their bikes with gear and embark on a multi-day trip. Bikepacking trails have grown popular in the western United States, but loops like the EMGBL are bringing Pennsylvania in the spotlight.

"We have all this great riding here," said Donna Iannone, an avid local cyclist who came up with the idea for the EMGBL. A resident of Sullivan County, she has cycled all over the world. "We want people to know about it."

The loop launched in the summer of 2022 and has already gained attention from cyclists throughout the United States and Canada. Not only is it an incredible ride, but it's also convenient and accessible for East Coast cyclists. In fact, the EMGBL is within a few hours' drive of Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, New York, and other major metro areas.



Sights & Stops

There's no shortage of things to see and do along the way.

"For this ride, we tried to incorporate some of the highlights that we have," explained Iannone. "I think riding through Worlds End is absolutely gorgeous on Route 154. Plus, up on the mountains and backroads, we have some great vistas."

Cyclists have the chance to visit some of the area's top outdoor destinations. Five state parks—Mount Pisgah, Ricketts Glen, Salt Springs, Vosburg Neck, and Worlds End—are located along or near the designated route. The EMGBL also follows part of the popular D&H Rail-Trail, which was named Pennsylvania's 2021 Trail of the Year.

Beyond the rugged off-road adventures, the EMGBL is also a great way to discover local communities.

"I really want people to go to our historic downtowns," said Cain Chamberlin, executive director of the Endless Mountains Heritage Region and one of the organizers of the EMGBL. "I think there are so many hidden gems that people who are coming to this area haven't experienced before."

In town, cyclists can kick back and relax at local shops, restaurants, wineries, and breweries. Meanwhile, museums and historic sites capture the area's rich past. Don't miss iconic landmarks like the Tunkhannock Creek Viaduct in Nicholson or the Starrucca Viaduct near Lanesboro, just to name a few.



A growing bike-friendly business program ensures that cyclists have the support they need for the journey. For example, Dandy Mini Marts offers bike racks and repair stations at their locations in North Towanda, Mehoopany, and Mildred.

At the end of the day, cyclists can rest and recharge at the many hotels, bed and breakfasts, and campgrounds along the route. These convenient accommodations make it easy to pedal from town to town.

Plan Your Ride

Get off the beaten path and discover all that the Endless Mountains has to offer on the EMGBL. An interactive map is available online at www.emheritage.org/endless-mountains-gravel-bikepacking-loop. It includes points of interest, bike-friendly businesses, and other helpful resources.



Downloadable maps are also available on Strava and Ride with GPS.

Looking for a shorter ride? A connector route divides the EMGBL into eastern and western halves, which are just right for a long weekend trip.

Last but not least, stay safe and make sure to follow Pennsylvania bicycle laws. The interactive map shows rural areas where cell phone reception is low, so an emergency alert device or a satellite GPS locator is recommended. Always wear a helmet and bright colors, and stay alert, even on roads that appear to be quiet.

The EMGBL is made possible by the Bradford County Tourism Promotion Agency; Endless Mountains Heritage Region; Endless Mountains Visitors Bureau; Northern Tier Regional Planning & Development Commission; and a dedicated committee of local cyclists, government officials, and outdoor enthusiasts.

Grinduro

June 16 - 18, 2023

This world-class race series returns to Sullivan County for the second year in a row. Combining elements of a mountain bike enduro and a gravel grinder, the event offers a 70-mile race and a shorter 37-mile option. Stick around all weekend for a fun, festival-style atmosphere complete with camping, music, food, and more.

Lake Carey Loop Triathlon

September 17, 2023

This sprint distance triathlon features your choice of a swim or paddle on Lake Carey, a bike ride through the rolling hills, and a 5K along the shoreline.

Tour de Shunk

September 17, 2023

This beloved annual event features routes for every level, from the classic century ride to shorter, non-competitive options. The tour benefits Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Twin Tiers.

And don't miss the **D&H Rail-Trail**, which was named Pennsylvania's Trail of the Year in 2021.

Visit a State Park

The Endless Mountains region is home to four state parks, which are free to enter. **Ricketts Glen State Park** in Sullivan County is famous for its 22 named waterfalls, most of which you can see along the challenging Falls Trail. **Salt Springs State Park** near Montrose boasts a plunging gorge and towering old-growth hemlock forests. **Worlds End State Park** in Forksville is known for its jaw-dropping vistas. And **Vosburg Neck State Park**, one of Pennsylvania's newest parks, provides access to the serene Susquehanna River and surrounding woodlands.

6 Take the Kids to the Children's Garden

Who knew that learning could be so fun? The **Clifford Children's Garden** is a one-acre park filled with imaginative, heritage-based play areas. Kids can explore local history with a Native American village, a replica mine shaft, a pioneer homestead, and more. Meanwhile, science comes to life with a butterfly garden and a dinosaur play area. The garden was created by the Clifford Township Historical Society and is located next to the Clifford Township Community Park.

7 Step Back in Time at Eagles Mere

Learn all about "the town that time forgot" at the **Eagles Mere Museum**. Located in the heart of the historic village, this museum features interactive exhibits about the town and Eagles Mere Lake, the local glassmaking industry, agriculture, trains, and more. They even have a treasure hunt for children. Admission is free, but donations are welcome. The museum is open seasonally and by appointment, so call ahead to plan your visit.

8 Soak Up the Views

No need to hike deep into the wilderness to enjoy scenic views of the Endless Mountains. In Sullivan County, you can drive to several panoramic vistas. The **Loyalsock Canyon Vista** is a breathtaking overview of Worlds End and the vast forest beyond. You can reach it by taking Mineral Spring and Cold Run roads. **High Knob Overlook** in Muncy Valley is another local favorite that offers a bird's-eye view at 2,000 feet.

9 Visit an Alpaca Farm

Meet some furry friends at one of our local alpaca farms. **Alpacas of Sunshine Farm** in New Milford and **Artisan Alpacas LLC** in Dushore welcome visitors to meet the herd, feed them treats, and learn more about these adorable animals. Both are small, family-run farms, so call ahead before you visit.

10 Go Birdwatching

Our pristine forests and wetlands not only draw in human visitors—they also attract countless species of migratory birds. Over 180 species have been known to visit the **Woodbourne Forest Preserve** near Dimock, which the Pennsylvania Game Commission recognized as one of the top 100 birding locations in the state. The glacial pond and dense woodlands at **Florence Shelly Preserve** in Thompson also boast diverse species. And bring your binoculars if you're by the **Susquehanna River** because bald eagle sightings are common.

The Martins Creek Viaduct

NEW OVERLOOK SHOWCASES KINGSLEY BRIDGE

At 150 feet tall and 1,600 feet long, the Martins Creek Viaduct is nothing short of awe-inspiring. Known locally as the Kingsley Bridge, the massive concrete structure stretches across the valley with arches soaring high above the farmland and forests below.

It's a scene that Richard Zick, president emeritus of the Brooklyn Historical Society, knows well. As a boy, he remembers gazing at the viaduct from the hilltops of his family farm.

"The railroad and the bridge just excited me as a little kid," he recalled. "I used to see the steam engines going across there. The trains would be over a mile long, hauling coal out of Scranton and going north. During the war years, the train would haul troops. Then, there would be a whole trainload of Army trucks, Jeeps, or tanks. It was an exciting time in my life."

For many years, a small, unofficial pull-off provided a view of the bridge. Locals knew the spot, but otherwise, it was off the beaten path.

"It just seemed like something that ought to be enjoyed by more people," explained Zick.

Working with the current landowner, the Brooklyn Historical Society constructed the Martins Creek Viaduct Scenic Overlook on Zicks Hill Road. The view opened in summer 2022 and features an informational sign and a gravel parking area.

"We put up a security camera, and there isn't a day goes by that I don't see somebody there," said Zick. "We've had as high as fifteen or seventeen people there in a given day."

The new overlook provides a sweeping panoramic view where sightseers can admire the bridge, take photos, and learn a bit about the region's railroading legacy.

HISTORY OF THE VIADUCT

The Martins Creek Viaduct was constructed between 1912 and 1914 for the Delaware, Lackawanna and Western Railroad Company. Both the Martins Creek Viaduct and its larger, younger cousin, the Tunkhannock Creek Viaduct, were part of a new and improved rail line called the Clarks Summit-Hallstead Cutoff. The cutoff would eliminate the steep grades, sharp curves, and unsafe public crossings of the original railroad.

Builders used the most cutting-edge techniques to construct the Martins Creek Viaduct, including some of the same technologies used to create the Panama Canal just a few years earlier. Steam-powered machinery made construction faster than ever before. Members of the American Society of Civil Engineers traveled all the way from New York City to see this man-made wonder.

The Martins Creek Viaduct was completed ahead of schedule and under budget. To celebrate, the railroad hosted the "Aerial Dance" on top of the bridge on September 3, 1914. About 200 guests attended. A construction derrick served as a makeshift elevator and hoisted carriages full of attendees up to the deck. The extravagant party even featured electric lights, elaborate decorations, and a performance by the Oppenheim Orchestra of New York City.

The bridge officially opened in 1915. During World War I, soldiers set up an Army camp just north of the bridge to guard it from bombings. This carried over into World War II, when local air wardens watched the skies for planes.

The Martins Creek Viaduct still stands today as a reminder of Susquehanna County's role in America's railroading history. In fact, it is still in use by the Norfolk Southern Railroad, and several trains pass by each day. If you're lucky, you'll spot one crossing the bridge.

VISIT THE OVERLOOK

For the best views, visit the Martins Creek Viaduct Scenic Overlook on Zicks Hill Road near Kingsley. If using Google Maps, search "Scenic Overlook (Kingsley Bridge) Viaduct." Note that cell phone service may be limited, so print directions or download an offline map before your trip.

From Interstate 81: Take exit 211 and follow signs for PA-106 West. Continue on PA-106 West for about 6 miles until you reach Kingsley, then turn left onto Route 11 South. Continue for about 2 miles, then turn right onto Charles Road. Cross the bridge, and you will reach the intersection of Creek Road and Zicks Hill Road. Continue up Zicks Hill Road for about 0.3 mile. The overlook will be on your right.

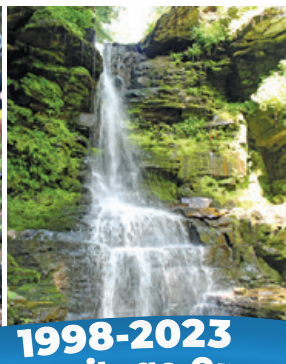

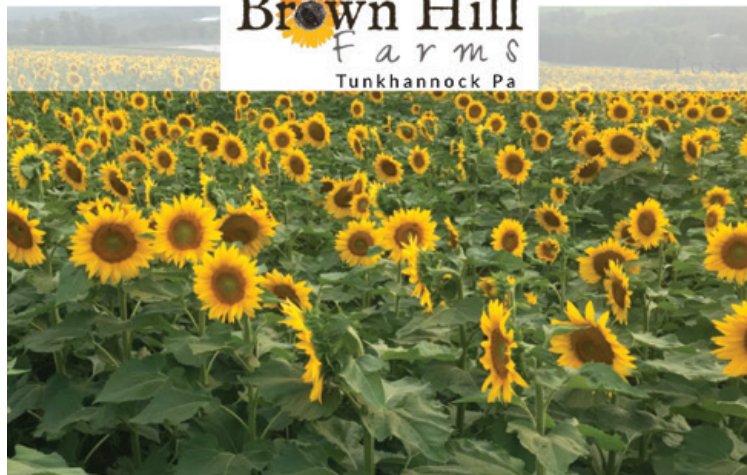

THE DIETRICH THEATER

Celebrating Arts, Culture, & Community

In the shadow of the Great Depression, a businessman named George Dietrich thought that Tunkhannock could use a little bit of joy. He knew the perfect escape: the movies. In 1937, he built the Dietrich Theater, complete with modern marvels like a deluxe sound system and air conditioning. On opening weekend alone, over 1,500 people came to see the new state-of-the-art theater.

The Dietrich continued to show movies until the 1980s. Like many small-town theaters, it struggled to compete with the massive cineplexes and had to shut its doors. But without the Dietrich, downtown Tunkhannock felt like it was missing something. A group of volunteers gathered together and plotted how to bring the beloved local theater back to life. After lots of hard work and an outpouring of community support, the Wyoming County Cultural Center at the Dietrich Theater reopened in 2001 and has been a local staple ever since. You can't mistake its sleek Art Deco architecture, the red glow of the marquee, and the buttery aroma of their legendary popcorn wafting down East Tioga Street. From family movie nights to first dates, this historic four-screen theater is full of memories and nostalgia that you'll just never find at a movie theater at the mall.

Yet, the Dietrich offers so much more than the movies. As a nonprofit, they also host countless educational programs, art classes, and community events.

20 Years of Fine Films

Although you can always catch the latest blockbusters, the Dietrich is also well-known for their seasonal film festivals. Each festival is three weeks long and typically features 21 independent and foreign films (perfect for watching a different movie every day).

Fall 2023 will mark the twentieth anniversary of the film festivals.

“We started them to bring a different kind of film offering to our community,” explained Erica Rogler, executive director. “Over the years, we’ve definitely cultivated an audience. The Dietrich is now a destination for independent and foreign films. I like to think of it as the Sundance on the Susquehanna.”

Normally, film buffs would have to go to an art house theater to see many of these films. However, viewers from near and far come to the Dietrich to experience the movies in a beautiful, historic community.

“We get people from Long Island and Philadelphia,” noted Rogler. “They have these film offerings in their own cities, but they love to come to the Endless Mountains and make a weekend of it. We treasure that.”

Every film festival kicks off with an opening night gala, which features two films and an abundance of local snacks, wine, and beer. A few years ago, the Dietrich also added a free preview day, where viewers can watch the trailers and plan which movies they want to see.

Arts for All Ages

Beyond the big screen, the Wyoming County Cultural Center at the Dietrich Theater is also a local hub for the arts and education.

“Since day one, the mission has always been to use the money from the movies

to support cultural programming for all ages,” said Rogler.

The theater is truly a home for the arts with studios, galleries, performance space, and more. As soon as you walk into the lobby, you’re greeted with local artwork and historical exhibits. Even the building—adorned with murals of Vosburg Neck and the Tunkhannock Creek Viaduct—is a work of art in itself.

The Dietrich hosts a variety of classes, events, lectures, and exhibits that are equal parts enriching and entertaining.

“We have lots of different art classes and health and wellness classes for all ages. We also have events to bring the community together,” said Mary Turner, assistant cultural director.

At the Dietrich, you can learn everything from pottery and jewelry making to yoga and qigong. Their children’s programming is especially robust, ranging from preschool art classes to summer drama camps for tweens and teens. They even coordinate community events like the annual River Day, a celebration of nature, music, and family fun at Tunkhannock’s Riverside Park.

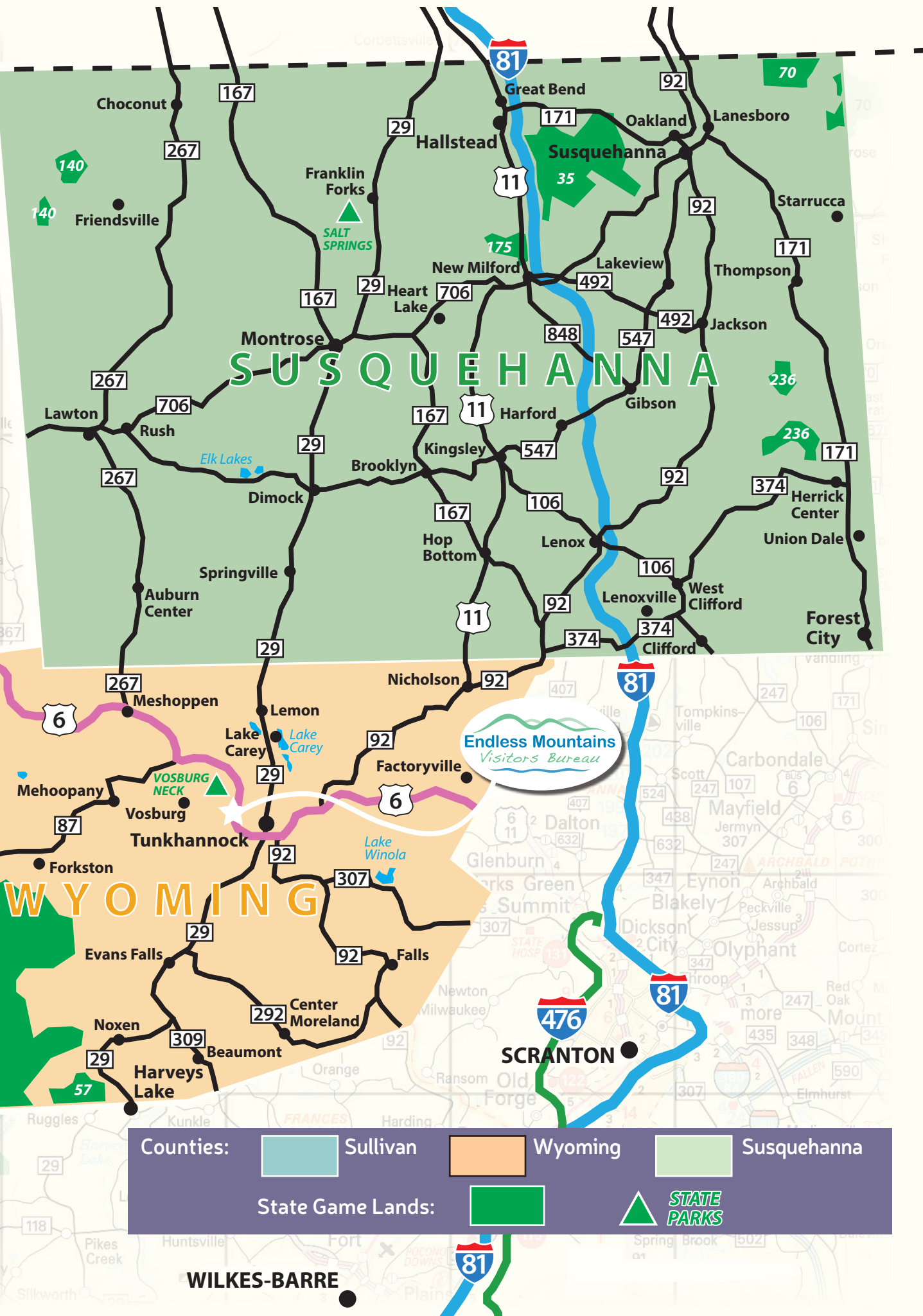

SUSQUEHANNA RIVER NORTH BRANCH

Pennsylvania's 2023 River of the Year

If you've ever paddled along the current, cast a line into the water, or strolled along its banks, then you know the beauty of the Susquehanna River North Branch. It's no wonder that this scenic, historic waterway was voted Pennsylvania's 2023 River of the Year.

The Susquehanna River North Branch Water Trail stretches about 181 miles from the New York border to Sunbury. It crosses eight counties in Pennsylvania, including Susquehanna and Wyoming counties. In the Endless Mountains, the river boasts incredible scenery, including rocky cliffs, sweeping valleys, and tranquil forests. If you keep your eyes peeled, it's not uncommon to spot bald eagles.

The North Branch is not only an iconic piece of our landscape, but it's also part of our region's rich history. Sacred Native American sites line the banks. Ruins of canals and ferry systems provide a glimpse of life in the nineteenth century, while remnants from the anthracite coal industry serve as reminders of the area's crucial role in the Industrial Revolution.



Today, the Susquehanna River North Branch is a destination for kayaking, canoeing, fishing, and wildlife watching. Take a paddling trip with **Endless Mountain Outfitters** in Sugar Run or **Susquehanna Kayak & Canoe Rentals** in Falls. Both businesses can provide the gear and guidance you need for a fun day on the river. Try your hand at fishing with **Al's Susquehanna Guide Service**. Or enjoy the stunning views from community parks like **Ira Reynolds Riverfront Park** in Susquehanna, **Riverside Park** in Tunkhannock, or **Vosburg Neck State Park** in Tunkhannock.

The water trail is co-managed by the Endless Mountains Heritage Region and the Susquehanna Greenway Partnership. These organizations offer helpful maps and resources. The Endless Mountains Heritage Region, which nominated the North Branch this year, also sells a waterproof map and guide.

Vosburg Neck

Discover One of Pennsylvania's Newest State Parks

On a brisk autumn day, visitors gathered beside the Susquehanna River, surrounded by craggy cliffs and rolling mountains. Beneath the boughs of an ancient oak tree, state and local officials made an announcement that would go down in local history—Vosburg Neck would officially become the first state park in Wyoming County.

Located just outside of Tunkhannock, Vosburg Neck was one of three new state parks approved by former Governor Tom Wolf in 2022. However, the area was a local favorite long before the big announcement. Previously known as the Howland Preserve, the property is a destination for hikers and paddlers.

Local History Meets Stunning Scenery

Vosburg Neck is situated on an oxbow bend where the river curves around the land, carving a plunging U-shape around the mountains. It is named for Abraham Vosburg, who was given the land in the 1700s after serving in the Revolutionary War. The park's rich heritage is part of what makes it special.

"In addition to being the first state park in the county, I think that the Vosburg Neck is an interesting time capsule for the region," said Karley Stasko, marketing and development director at North Branch Land Trust. "From the pre-colonial to the post-industrial, there are historical breadcrumbs sprinkled throughout the property."

Notable features include eighteenth- and nineteenth-century buildings, remnants of the old canal, a historic rail bed, and a 1700s-era cemetery.

Centuries later, landowner Ernest Howland left the property to North Branch Land Trust. The land opened to the public as the Howland Preserve.

"I first visited Howland after the land trust acquired it in 2003," recalled Ellen Ferretti, executive director of North Branch Land Trust. "Everything was overshadowed by the beauty of the land and being able to walk right down to the mighty Susquehanna River. Right there, at that spot, the view is magnificent."

In Howland's will, he hoped that the land would ultimately become a county or state park. Nearly twenty years later, his wish became a reality.



STATE PARK

Things to Do

Exciting additions and improvements are on their way, but there's already plenty for visitors to enjoy. The park encompasses 669 acres, ranging from dense woodlands to bucolic meadows to the peaceful riverbanks.

Park manager Nicholas Sulzer remembers his first time touring the area. "Traveling into the park on Vosburg Road, the serene mountain landscape as you descended into the river valley passing local farms really made a huge first impression," he said. "Then, when you get into the park and stop and just listen, it's very peaceful. You have the river flowing and the sounds of nature."

One of the highlights is the easy access to the Susquehanna River. The park currently offers a non-motorized boat launch, which is perfect to kayaking and canoeing.

The park also features about eight miles of hiking trails, which are generally moderate and family friendly. The Old Farm Road Trail is an easy out-and-back stroll through the fields, while routes like the Whitetail Trail ramble through the forests. The Vista Trail is more challenging, but well worth the effort. At 2.3 miles long, the trail climbs up the hill to a sweeping lookout point, where you'll be rewarded with a view of the river and farmlands below.

"Between exploring the trails and spending some time relaxing along the river, you cannot go wrong," said Sulzer.

Plan Your Visit

Vosburg Neck State Park is open daily from sunrise to sunset. Day use areas close at dusk. Portable, temporary bathrooms are currently available until permanent facilities are built.

The park is just a short drive from Tunkhannock. From town, take US 6 West about six miles and turn left at the stoplight onto Vosburg Road. Drive 2.6 miles down Vosburg Road and turn left at the parking area beside the barn.

While boating, please abide by all park rules and Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission regulations. Only non-motorized boats are allowed at this time, and you'll need to display boat registration or a launching permit.

Trail maps are posted on the side of the barn. Maps and park information are also available online at www.visitparks.com.
